TREE TRIMMING REMINDER

One of the most appealing natural features of Three Springs is the profusion of oak trees and other specimen trees indigenous to the area in which Three Springs is located. To perpetuate the survival of these trees, is the responsibility of each owner whose lot contains one or more indigenous oak trees and other specimen trees to cultivate properly and maintain such trees in the best possible condition.

Please also remember to maintain your front yard trees and trim as needed so as not to overhang or otherwise to encroach upon the sidewalk from ground level to a height of ten (10) feet.
